Multi-Disciplinary Team

At the heart of the One Place Child Advocacy Center's commitment to protect and serve victims of child abuse is our Multidisciplinary Team (MDT).

This group of investigators, child advocates, and other experts comprises representatives from every law-enforcement agency in Onslow County and members involved in prosecution, mental health, child advocacy, medicine, child-protective services, and other disciplines.

The MDT responds quickly to concerns of child abuse and determines the best response for the child and family. The collaboration with the CAC reduces the number of times a child has to speak about their abuse, helps families access services, and encourages safety and healing for children and families. We are so thankful for the members of our MDT. From protecting children and promoting successful legal intervention to ensuring the availability of appropriate follow-on services and reducing trauma to children, we couldn't do the work without them.

So this month (Child Abuse Prevention Month) and every other month of the year, we say THANK YOU for the valuable role you all play in child abuse prevention and intervention in our community.
