Child Mental Health Matters

May is Mental Health Awareness Month, a time to highlight the importance of emotional well-being for all—especially our youngest community members. Children's mental health lays the foundation for lifelong success in relationships, learning, and emotional resilience.

At One Place, we recognize that early experiences shape the developing brain, and we are committed to supporting children's mental health through trauma-informed services. Our programs nurture social and emotional development by helping children build the capacity to experience and regulate emotions, form secure relationships, and explore the world around them in safe, supportive environments.

We also empower parents, caregivers, and early educators with tools and training to foster positive, responsive interactions that promote healthy development.

When victims of child abuse and neglect receive services in the One Place Child Advocacy Center, they are connected to on-site mental health services to help them heal.

May is Safe Kids Month!


Did you know that One Place serves as the lead agency for the Safe Kids Coalition in Onslow County? We also have four staff members who are certified child passenger safety technicians.

Every year, children across the country are injured in preventable events. Safe Kids is a national organization dedicated to protecting children from unintentional injuries by sharing education programming to reduce traffic injuries, drownings, falls, burns, and other tragedies.

Onslow County has a Safe Kids chapter that supports families in our community with car seat installation, car seat check-ups, safety workshops, and other events to help prevent childhood injuries.
